***** DINNER RESERVATIONS *****

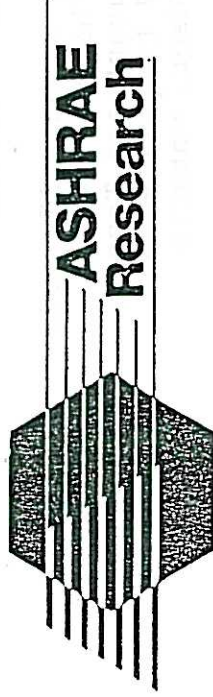
